Increase in Ad Hoc Flights to Velana International Airport

According to statistics revealed by Maldives Airports Company Limited (MACL), Ad Hoc flights, including private jets, to Maldives Velana International Airport (VIA) have increased since the Maldives' borders reopened.

The statistics revealed that during July, 28 Ad Hoc flights landed on the airport whereas in August, the flights saw an increase of 111% with a total of 59 flights. In September, there were 60 flights and in October, 126 flights, which is a 110% increase in flight arrivals from September to October.

Latest statistics by Maldives Immigration show that a total of 27,217 tourists have arrived

during the first three months of borders reopening.

With the resumption of tourism in the country and arrival of more flights to the country, the tourist arrival rate has gradually increased which in turn promises more arrivals by the end of the year. Maldivian, the national flagship carrier is also expected to resume scheduled international flights over the coming months.

According to reports of MACL, jet movements at VIA and charter flight numbers are seeing a positive increase rate during this winter season.





GoAir Resumes Operation of Direct Flights to Maldives



India's most trusted airline brand, GoAir has announced the resumption of direct flights to the Maldives starting November 1, 2020. The airline's first passenger flight arrived at Velana International Airport today afternoon from Delhi.

Tourists arriving in the Maldives are to present a mandatory negative PCR test, along with a completed Traveler Health Declaration Form, submitted online via IMUGA (www.imuga.immigration.gov.mv) before arrival in the country. Guests can now submit a negative PCR test acquired 96 hours prior to take-off as imposed by the Ministry of Tourism. Tests exceeding this time period are invalid and must be retaken.

Maldives Added to UK's Travel Corridors List: Passengers Arriving from the Destination to be No Longer Quarantined



Maldives has been added to the UK's Travel Corridors list, allowing travellers returning back from the island destination to be exempt from undergoing the quarantine process.

"Following an assessment from the latest data, the Canaries, the Maldives, Denmark and Mykonos have been added to the Travel Corridors list," said Rt Hon Grant Shapps, Secretary of State for Transport, UK.

From October 25, those returning from Maldives, the Canaries, Denmark and Mykonos will no longer need to self-isolate as announced by the Government of UK.

Chief Executive of tourism firm Kuoni, Derek Jones expressed joy with this new decision. "This is a very welcome development. We are anticipating a surge in demand for Maldives holidays," said Derek.

With the reopening of the Maldives' borders on 15th July 2020, Maldives Marketing and Public Relations Corporation (MMPRC) launched an outdoor campaign in major parts of the UK to promote the destination as a safe haven for travelers, as travel resumes in the new normal.

Gulf Air Resumes Direct Flights to Maldives Commencing from December 12



Gulf Air, the national carrier of the Kingdom of Bahrain, has announced that it will resume direct flights to and from Velana International Airport in the Maldives with two weekly flights starting from December 12,

The flights will be operated by the airline's newest Airbus 321neoLR which features 150 seats in economy class and 16 flat-bed seats in Falcon Gold class. Gulf Air's first flight to the Maldives landed in Male' on October 27, 2019 and it has been the airline's key boutique destination in the Indian Ocean.

The airline currently flies to and from Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Kuwait, Jeddah, Dammam, Medina, Muscat, Cairo, Amman, London, Paris, Frankfurt, Athens, Manila, Dhaka and several destinations in India and Pakistan.

Being one of the few airlines that continued scheduled commercial operations, Gulf Air continuously works closely with the government authorities throughout the destinations on its network to resume operations as soon as airports open. Hoarafushi Airport to be Completed in November 2020

Maldives Transport and Contracting Company (MTCC) has announced that works are underway to complete the Regional Airport located in the Island of HA. Hoarafushi by November 11, 2020.

CEO of MTCC visited the airport area and inspected the ongoing works as well as the concluded parts of the project. He further determined the remaining works left to be completed with help from on-site workers. According to the company, overall works of the airport project are coming along smoothly at a fast pace compared to during the past few months and the project is expected to be finished by the announced date.

The scope of the project includes the construction of a 1200m runway, 8,635m2 of apron and taxiway, service roads in front of the terminal, 9.473m2 of parking area, 1,718m2 of fire access road, a fire building, a passenger terminal, 720m of airport security and a beach fence area.

Development of Regional Airports such as the Hoarafushi Airport will make guest transfer more convenient in the northernmost atolls. Moreover, these airports are a vital infrastructure to support our ever-expanding tourism industry, says the Government.





Split Stay Allowed at All Types of Tourist Accomodation Facilities in Maldives







Health Protection Agency (HPA) of Maldives has permitted split stay between tourist establishments with prior approval.

Tourists can now split their stay between resort, hotels, liveaboards and guesthouses, with prior approval as per split-stay procedure / guideline by Ministry of Tourism.

All facilities must submit a 'no objection form' for the split-stay to the Tourism Ministry, at least 48 hours prior to the travelling date.

Previously, tourists were permitted to enter the country without observing quarantine, provided that they remain at the establishment where initial bookings were made, precluding any movement between islands or liveaboards throughout the duration of their stay.

Switzerland Marks Maldives as a Safe **Destination for Travel**



Switzerland has marked Maldives as safe for travel. Maldives was removed from Switzerland's high-risk countries list on October 29, 2020, which means that travelers from Maldives to Switzerland will no longer be subjected to a 10-day quarantine upon return.

Swiss luxury airline, Edelweiss Air is among the many international airlines to have resumed operations to Maldives, providing a direct link between Malé and Zurich.

The decision to ease travel restrictions between the two countries was made following the addition of Maldives to the UK's Global Safe Travel List and Qatar's Green List recently.

Additionally, Maldives has received the Safe Travels Stamp granted by the World Travel and Tourism Council (WTTC). The Airports Council International (ACI) has also awarded accreditation status to the Velana International Airport (VIA).

Maldives is currently open to tourists of all nationalities with several tourist establishments resuming operations. Tourists are required to fill an online health declaration form within 24 hours prior to departure, and a negative COVID-19 PCR test result taken maximum 96 hours prior to departure to Maldives is mandatory.

This decision will hopefully increase tourist arrivals from the country. The government along with the tourism industry and stakeholders are working tirelessly to ensure that Maldives is a safe haven for all, and to reach a favorable tourist arrival rate by the end of the year.
